

The Brian Beury Basketball Camp Frequently Asked Questions

1 – Our programs:

Day Camps are for children ages 7 through 18. Programs run Monday through Friday 8:30am to 4:30pm

Half-Day Camps are for children ages 5, 6 & 7. Programs run Monday through Friday 8:30am to 12noon.

Our programs are designed to teach the fundamentals of the game of basketball. We teach the same skills that we teach our college players at Saint Rose. We begin with the basics and progress each day. More experienced players will be challenged at a more advanced level in our skill sessions.

We work on every skill from running and jumping, footwork and agility, balance, dribbling, passing, shooting, both individual and team defense, rebounding, team play etc. We work on shooting multiple times each day.

Each camper is placed on a camp team with a coach. Teams practice and play at least two games each day.

Each camper is an individual and we work on his or her confidence and self-esteem throughout the week. The goal is to give campers a positive experience and with that boost in self-esteem they'll continue to practice the new skills they've learned once they get home.

While our Boys, Girls and our 5, 6 & 7 year old campers will each be at Rensselaer Jr. Sr. High School at the same time, each group will be in separate gyms for their respective programs throughout the program.

2-Where will Camp activities occur?

The camp is hosted on the campus of Rensselaer Jr. Sr. High School, 25 Van Rensselaer Dr., Rensselaer NY 12144, located less than 1 minute from Interstate 90 & Interstate 787.

We will utilize all three indoor gymnasiums that are located at the school, all under one roof. All our activities are indoors.

All Campers can be dropped off at Rensselaer Jr. Sr. High School, 25 Van Rensselaer Dr., Rensselaer NY 12144. Staff will be waiting outside

the school's main entrance to assist you with check in. There's plenty of quick & easy parking for drop off & pick up each day.

3 – How old do you have to be to attend camp?

Our Full Day Camps are for Campers' ages 7 through 18 - Typically a rising second grader through a rising high school senior. Campers are grouped by age and or ability.

Half-Day Camps are for children ages 5, 6 & 7.

4 – Our staff:

Our staff is balanced with College, High School and AAU coaches as well as current and former College basketball players as well as professional players who aspire to coach the game of basketball at a high level. We have no junior counselors who work with campers on skills or drills at our camp. Our entire camp program is supervised and directed by adults.

Brian Beury, the Head Men's Basketball Coach at The College of Saint Rose, founded both the Girls and Boy's camps in 1986 and has directed every phase of the program since. Coach Beury is present every day of the Camp. He personally hires all the staff each week. Camp staff is made up of adults paid for their Basketball Expertise. The camp staff is the backbone of our program. Coach hires a combination of College Coaches, High School and AAU Coaches, Professional Players as well as College Players who aspire to coach basketball at the highest level possible. We do not hire junior counselors, CIT's, or volunteers. All staff must go through a NY State Dept. of Social Services background check each summer before they can work at the camp. **We also have an Athletic Trainer and a Registered Nurse at camp throughout each week.**

5 - What is a sample day like?

The Day Camp begins at 8:30 and ends at 4:30. Once Coach Beury finishes his Daily Staff Meeting he addresses the campers with the "thought for the Day" and Camp begins.

The Half Day Camp begins at 8:30 and ends at 12noon.

Camp is very organized. Even our free time is limited and always supervised. Each morning a new daily schedule of all activities is

available and reviewed with campers in their morning “team meetings”.

6 – Is there Early Drop off or Late Pick Up?

We try and accommodate the schedules of our working parents therefore we are at camp by 8am each day and would like to leave by 5pm daily. In some cases we can help arrange car pools for campers from many different communities.

7 - What do I bring to camp? What should I wear?

Day Campers should dress ready to play basketball each day before they arrive at camp. They should also bring a lunch and a drink. There will be snacks and drinks available to purchase at the camp concession each day. Campers will have access to plenty of (free) cold water throughout the day.

8- Does the Camp provide meals or drinks?

Meals are not included in the cost of attendance for our **Day Campers**. Campers will have access to plenty of (free) cold water throughout the day. There is a concession available where campers can buy pizza, snacks and drinks daily.

9- How much does it cost to attend camp?

Our **Day Camps** are Monday through Friday 8:30am through 4:30pm. Day Camp costs \$225.00 for the week. \$400.00 if you register for both weeks.

Our **Half Day Camps** are Monday through Friday 8:30am through 12noon. Day Camp costs \$125.00 for the week. \$200.00 if you register for both weeks.

10 - How do I apply?

Payment may be submitted online with a credit card or by mail with a check. You will receive confirmation email after payment is received.

Receipt of payment will secure enrollment.

11 - What is your refund policy? Do I get a refund if my child is sick or injured and cannot attend camp?

REFUND POLICY: It is the policy of The Brian Beury Basketball Camp to refund those campers who withdraw from camp prior to July 1, 2016, less a \$25.00 processing fee.

After July 1, 2016 it is our Policy not to refund registrants who do not attend camp except for health reasons preventing participation that are validated by a signed doctor's note received prior to the start of camp and approved by the Director. Refunds are granted only for documented medical reasons.

There are no refunds for camp once the week that the camper is registered for has begun. Any request for refund after July 1, 2016 will be less a \$75.00 processing fee, even those with a documented medical reason.

There are no exceptions to this policy. Refunds are not processed until after August 31, 2016.

12 - What happens if my child is injured or sick during camp?

A Registered Nurse and Certified Athletic Trainer will be present throughout the duration of camp and will be prepared to deal with any emergencies that should arise. In addition, most of our staff possesses CPR and First Aid training as required by NYS in order to coach at a high school or college. Parents will be contacted in the event of an emergency. WE have thorough Camp Medical Plans in place.

Any Medications that your child may need to take during camp will be administered to the camper each time they need it. Each time this happens the camp medical staff will log it in our Medical Log.

All medications, except Asthma medications or Epi-Pens, should be handed to camp staff at check in with instructions. All medications will be kept locked in our Camp Infirmary.

13– When is the registration deadline? How can I reserve a space in the Brian Beury Basketball Camp?

There is no registration deadline. Applications will be received until camp is sold out.

Your camp application and medical/consent form must be received with your payment in order for a spot to be reserved for you.

14 - My child is a Center/Point Guard/Shooting Guard, etc. Will you have specialized training for them?

We are a fundamentals camp. We will teach the fundamentals of each position to our campers. Coach Beury believes that all players, regardless of size or position, must be able to dribble, pass and shoot as well as run, defend and rebound. We will work with each camper on any additional skills they wish to work on while at camp. Each day there are opportunities for our coaches to work on individual skills with our campers.

15 - Can I fax my Camp Application?

Yes, our fax number is (518) 458-5457. However, a spot will only be reserved once payment is received.

16- Can I pay by Credit Card?

Yes, you can pay either the full tuition payment or the deposit of \$75.00 with your credit card by registering online at www.brianbeaurybasketballcamp.com

17 - When is the final payment due?

The final payment for our Camps is due prior to the start of each camp but we prefer payment be made by July 1st, 2016. If you registered online you can pay your balance online or you may send a check for the remaining balance to: Brian Beaury Basketball Camp to:

Final Camp Payments should be made before camp check-in. If a balance remains Cash or Money Order is preferred at Check –in.

18 - Who should checks be addressed to?

All checks should be payable to " Brian Beaury Basketball Camp".

19 - Are there any Discounts?

We also offer special "Team" discounts for 8 or more campers that register together and pay in full by mail. Call our email office to discuss that with Coach Beaury (518) 458-5490

20 - Do I need to submit a release form and health record in order to participate?

Yes, in order to participate, participants are required to submit our completed medical/health forms with current immunization records prior to the start of camp. These required forms will be attached to the online registration or are in our brochure for those who register by mail. You must be prepared to submit a report of a physical examination conducted during the preceding 12 months that provides clearance to participate in sports and lists current medications and known allergies if requested. This is required by the New York State Department of Health.

20 - Can a camper arrive early or late? Can a camper leave

early or late?

Yes. We have campers coming late and leaving early for many events including: Doctor or Dental appointments, Vacation Plans, All Star games, Baseball Games, Softball Games, Summer School, Summer League Games, etc. However, the camper will be responsible for making his own arrangements with regards to transportation. If campers need to leave early, we need a written request from a parent (email is acceptable; bbeaurybasketballcamp@gmail.com) informing the director when the camper is being picked up and who is picking the camper up. You can also inform our staff about any drop off/pick up arrangements at the "check in desk" on the morning or afternoon about arrangements for that day or the next day. All final arrangements for pick up and drop off times and the appropriate locations will be made between camp directors and a parent in advance.

21 - Are parents allowed to watch?

While camp is for the camper's, parents can come to watch their child participate during any training and or games throughout the week.

22 - How can I reach camp staff or camper during camp?

Cell phones are allowed at the camp. Brian Beaury is at (518) 458-5490. Email is normally the quickest way to reach Brian Beaury, Camp Director: bbeaurybasketballcamp@gmail.com. We will also distribute a camp cell phone # and contact person if you need to contact us (or your child in the event of an emergency) during camp.

23 - Can I request a Teammate?

Campers may request teammates when they complete their registration or email or write Coach Beaury. Teammates must be close in age and/or ability. You may request up to 9 other players be on your team. Camp staff does it's best to accommodate all camper requests.

27 - Do I need to bring a Basketball?

We will provide new leather basketballs for all games and shooting

drills during camp. We have several hundred basketballs. You can leave yours home.

The Book on Brian Beaury

One of the most decorated and affluent college basketball coaches in the country, Brian Beaury has steadfastly developed a program that garners the utmost of respect from every corner, on every level of the game throughout his 30 years at The College of Saint Rose. His career has spanned five decades after arriving at Saint Rose as a student-athlete in 1978 and being hired as a coach in the 80's. Beaury, who is a member of three Halls of Fame, has continually left an indelible impression upon a group of young men whose predecessors not only continually surpassed all expectations, but also provided the College an avenue for national recognition.

"We have been very fortunate to have had great coaches and great players throughout the years. We have found a formula that works for us at Saint Rose. One of our goals is to attract players who will fit in with the rest of the College's student body and who are poised to develop as students, people and as players. We want to develop a

relationship where we'll be their coach for four years and their friends forever," says Beaury.

Beaury, who became just the 34th NCAA Division II head coach to reach the 500-win plateau in 2008-09, has an uncanny ability to instill his knowledge of the game into his student-athletes' performance. His teams have won an average of more than 17 games during the last 15 campaigns and have posted at least 20 wins on four occasions throughout that span. This knowledge has spread to the dozens of former players who have gone on to coach successfully at every level of the game.

Saint Rose won five consecutive regular-season East Coast Conference (formerly the NYCAC) titles, prior to its entrance into the Northeast-10 Conference in 2000-01, and has been awarded 12 NCAA Tournament bids in its 24 years competing exclusively at the NCAA Division II level. Saint Rose has compiled a 475-246 (.659) record during that time and has captured three NCAA Tournament Northeast Regional Championships on the way to three "Elite Eight" appearances and a trip to the "Final Four" in 1998. Furthermore, the Golden Knights advanced to the ECAC Championship Tournament in four of their non-NCAA Tournament years and came away with titles in both 1993 and 2001.

Beaury has furthermore established the Golden Knights as a traditional power within the NE-10, which has sent at least five teams to the NCAA Tournament in 10 of the past 11 seasons.

The 55-year-old mentor has compiled a 596-307 (.665) career record, has earned Coach of the Year plaudits on five separate occasions and was nominated for National Coach of the Year in 1989. He was furthermore inducted into the New York Capital Region Hall of Fame three years ago. He was previously inducted the New York State Basketball Coaches Hall of Fame in the spring of 2010. Six years ago, Saint Rose honored him by inducting him into its Athletics Hall of Fame.

Beaury stood tied for fifth among the nation's most successful NCAA Division II active coaches in terms of victories entering this season. Additionally, his teams have qualified for postseason play in 29 of his 30 seasons and have won eight conference titles. Saint Rose has also played on national television, has had just four losing seasons under his tutelage and has won at least 19 games throughout 21 of his 29 years on the bench.

Impressive stuff indeed; but when you're intelligent, committed, and know the kind of student-athletes who can succeed at Saint Rose, in addition to being a student of the game; good things are bound to come your way.

Beaury, who was Eastern Basketball's 1998 small college Coach of the Year, is in high demand on the lecture circuit. He has spoken at clinics throughout the world including the renowned Hoop Group and Five Star Basketball Camps.

Beaury has also guided several college All-Star teams on summer tours throughout the world in recent years. He has coached college players on visits to Greece, Turkey, Spain, Cuba, Germany, Dominica, Montserrat, and Antigua to mention a few. He has also guided the Golden Knights on team trips to Spain, Italy, Cuba, Australia, and Fiji. Four years ago, Saint Rose toured the Baltic countries of Latvia and Lithuania where they played seven games throughout a two-week period.

Prior to his duties being refocused entirely towards his coaching responsibilities, Beaury served Saint Rose as either the Assistant Athletic Director or Associate Athletic Director for 22 of his 30 years. As an administrator, Beaury helped lay the foundations for building the athletic department into a well-respected NCAA entity where student-athletes succeed both on and off the court, and have gone on to compete regionally and nationally.

A native of Queens and one of six children, Beaury played high school basketball at St. Agnes before heading to Saint Rose where he was a four-year letter winner. He was also the recipient of the College's 1996 Distinguished Alumni Award.

The three-time captain still ranks among the school's top-10 career leaders in both assists and steals. A two-time All-Conference selection who was the team's Most Valuable Player as a senior, Beaury entered the collegiate coaching ranks at the tender age of 21 when he landed the assistant's position at the Junior College of Albany in 1982. Beaury then returned to his alma mater in 1984 and two years later was named the College's second head coach. The rest you now know about.

Beaury also directs his own successful youth basketball camp every summer at the College. He was the founder of the Saint Rose Summer Sports Academy and is also the founder of the aforementioned New York State Basketball Coaches Association Hall of Fame.

Furthermore, Beaury was actively involved with the development office as co-chair of two different capital campaigns for Saint Rose, including the campaign to build the College's indoor and outdoor athletic facilities. Beaury also began the popular Annual Men's Basketball Golf Outing that is not in its seventeenth year.

Beaury earned both his bachelor's degree in business administration and his master's in education from Saint Rose. He resides in Cohoes, NY with his wife, the former Mary Ann Grennon (Saint Rose '82), also a member of the Saint Rose Athletics Hall of Fame, and their youngest son Ben, a sophomore student athlete at Le Moyne College in Syracuse. His oldest children, Alexandra and Brian, live and work in the Capital Region and can be seen at most home of the home games cheering on the Golden Knights. Mary Ann, Alex, Brian II and Ben all participate in the summer basketball camps. Alex is a Registered Nurse and Camp Medical Director.
