

**1 - Our programs:**

**Day Camps** are for children ages 7 through 18. Programs run Monday through Friday 8:30am to 4:30pm.  
**Half-Day Camps** are for children ages 5, 6 & 7. Programs run Monday through Friday 8:30am to 12:00pm.

Our programs are designed to teach the fundamentals of the game of basketball, we teach the new skills that we teach our college players at Camp Beary. We begin with the basics and progress each day. More experienced players will be challenged at a more advanced level in the skill sessions.

We work on every skill from running and jumping, footwork and agility, defense, shooting, passing, shooting, both individual and team defense, rebounding, team play etc. We work on shooting multiple times each day.

Each camper is placed on a camp team with a coach. Teams practice and play all their games each day.

Each camper is an individual and we work on his or her confidence and self-esteem throughout the week. The goal is to give campers a positive experience with their sport so will extend their lifetime to practice the new skills they've learned once they get home.

While our 8th, 9th and 10th, 11, & 12 year old campers will teach for at **Bennett Jr. Sr. High School** at the same time, each group will be in separate gym for their respective programs throughout the program.

**2-Where will Camp activities occur?**

The camp is located on the campus of **Bennett Jr. Sr. High School**, 25 1st **Bennett Dr. Bennett VA 22114**, located less than 1 mile from Interstate 90 & Interstate 787.

We will utilize all three indoor gymnasiums that are located at the school, all under one roof. All our activities are indoor.

3 - How old do you have to be to attend camp?

Our **Full Day Camps** are for Campers ages 7 through 18 - Typically a coach leading practice through a coach high school senior. Campers are grouped by age and/or ability.

**Half Day Camps** are for children ages 5, 6 & 7.

4 - Our staff:

Our staff is balanced with College, High School and AAU coaches as well as current and former College basketball players as well as professional players who agree to coach the girls or boys at a high level. We have no junior instructors who work with campers on M, Tu, or W at all of our camps. Our entire camp program is supervised and directed by adults.

Coach Beary, the Head Men's Basketball Coach at The College of Saint Benedict, coaches both the Girls and Boys camps at 1982 and has directed every phase of the program since Coach Beary's arrival every day of the camp. He supervises them all the time each week. Camp staff is made up of adults paid for their basketball expertise. The camp staff is the backbone of our program. Coach Beary's contribution of College Coaches, High School and AAU Coaches, Professional Players as well as College Players who agree to coach basketball at the highest level possible. We do not hire junior instructors, GTE, or volunteers. All staff must go through a 60 Day Camp of Saint Benedict Background Check each summer unless they can work at the camp. **We also have an ATHLETIC TRAINER and a Registered Nurse at camp throughout each week.**

5 - What is a sample day like?

The **Day Camp** begins at 8:30 and ends at 4:30. Once Coach Beary finishes his Daily Staff Meeting he addresses the campers with the "Thought for the Day" and Camp begins.

The **Half Day Camp** begins at 8:30 and ends at 12:00.

**4 - Is there Early Drop off or Late Pick Up?**

We try and accommodate the schedule of our working parents therefore we are at camp by 8am each day and would like to leave by 4pm daily. In some cases we can help arrange our parents to campers from many different communities.

**7 - What do I bring to camp? What should I wear?**

**Day Campers** should dress ready to play basketball each day before they arrive at camp. They should also bring a water and a drink. There will be snacks and drinks available to purchase at the camp concession each day. Campers will have access to plenty of fresh cold water throughout the day.

**8 - Does the Camp provide meals or drinks?**

Meals are not included in the cost of attendance for our **Day Campers**. Campers will have access to plenty of fresh cold water throughout the day. There is a concession available where campers can buy pizza, drinks and other items.

**9 - How much does it cost to attend camp?**

Our **Day Camps** are Monday through Friday 8:30am through 4:30pm. Day Camp costs \$400.00 for the season, \$100.00 if you register for two weeks and \$100.00 if you register for all three weeks.

Our **Half Day Camps** run Monday through Friday 9:30am through  
Lunch. Day Camp costs \$125.00 for the week \$300.00 if you  
register for all three weeks.

**10 - How do I apply?**

**11 - What is your refund policy? Do I get a refund if my child is  
sick or injured and cannot attend camp?**

**REFUND POLICY:** It is the policy of The Brown Bosony Bookended  
Camp to refund camp payments only withdrawn from camp prior to July  
1, 2014. See a full refund policy.

After July 1, 2014 it is our policy not to refund registrants who do not  
attend camp except for medical reasons. Documentation that  
are validated by a signed doctor's note document prior to the start of  
camp and approved by the Director. Refunds are granted only for  
documented medical reasons.

There are no refunds for camps after the week that the camper is  
registered for this longer. Any request for refund after July 1, 2014 will  
be for a \$125.00 processing fee even if there is a documented  
medical reason.

There are no exceptions to this policy. Refunds are not processed until  
after August 31, 2014.

**12 - What happens if my child is injured or sick during camp?**

A Registered Nurse and Certified Pediatric Nurse will be present  
throughout the duration of camp and will be prepared to deal with any  
emergencies that should arise. In addition, first aid and first aid kits are  
available and first aid training is required by all staff. In order to insure for a

**14 - My child is a Center/Point Guard/Shooting Guard, etc. Will you have specialized training for them?**

We are a fundamentals camp. We will teach the fundamentals of each position to our campers. Coach Beary believes that all players, regardless of size or position, must be able to shoot, pass and shoot as well as run, defend and rebound. We will work with each camper on any additional skills they wish to work on over a 6 day. Each day there are opportunities for our athletes to work on individual skills with our coaches.

We have been cancelling camps and leaving early for many weeks including: Doctor or Dental appointments, Vacation Plans, All Star games, Baseball Games, Softball Games, Summer School, Summer League Games, etc. However, the camper will be responsible for making his own arrangements with regards to transportation. The Head Coach's Bio:

One of the most decorated and affluent college basketball coaches in the country, Brian Beary has masterfully developed a program that garners the attention of ESPN SportsCenter, an entire host of the sports magazines, etc. He joins St. John's College in 2008. He spent his seasons from December after arriving at Saint John's in a player's uniform in 1976 and being hired as a coach in the 80's. Beary, who is a member of three halls of fame, has consistently an incredible reputation across a great of coaching when professionals are early community members of the profession, but also provides the College an avenue for national recognition.

We have been very fortunate to have had great coaches and great players throughout the years. We have found it fortunate that works for us at Saint John's. One of our goals is to attract players who will fit in with the rest of the College's student body and who are poised to develop as students, people and as players. We want to develop a

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Headlines often will be their coach for four years and their head coach," says Brady.

Brady, who became just the 26th NCAA Division II head coach to reach the 100-win games (2000-01), has an impressive 211-111-11 record in 41 years. His teams have won 10 national championships, 194 team titles and an average of more than 17 games during the last 15 campaigns and have won 20 of the last 21 national championships. Through that span, his knowledge has spread to the dozens of former players who have gone on to coach successfully at every level of the game.

Stacy Stone won five consecutive regular-season East Coast Conference titles for the NCAA's elite, junior to its respective division. Furthermore, 10 Conference in 2000-01, and has been named a NCAA Tournament host in its 24 years competitive involvement of the NCAA Division I level. Stacy Stone has compiled a 475-244 (.665) record during that time and has captured three NCAA Championship trophies.

Championships in the only in 1976-1978 eight appearances and a trip to the "Final Four" in 1988. Furthermore, the Golden Knights advanced to the ECAC Championship Tournament in four of their four NCAA Tournament years and came away with titles in both 1993 and 2001.

Brady has furthermore established the Golden Knights as a traditional power within the ECAC, which has won at least five teams to the NCAA Tournament in 10 of the past 11 seasons.

The 65-year-old mentor has compiled a 1916-927 (.683) career record, has earned Coach of the Year awards on five separate occasions and was named National Coach of the Year in 1989. He was furthermore inducted into the New York Capital Region Hall of Fame three years ago (he was previously inducted the New York State Biographical Council Hall of Fame in the spring of 2010, six years ago). Stacy Stone honored him by inducting him into its Athletics Hall of Fame.

Brady's third bid for 8th among the nation's most successful NCAA Division II coaches in terms of victories entering this season. Additionally, his teams have qualified for postseason play in 29 of his 30 seasons and have won 107 of 117 national titles. Stacy Stone has also played an active role in the sport, having coached three of his 29 years, and has won at least 10 games throughout 21 of his 29 years on the bench.

Impressive staff indeed, but when you're intelligent, committed, and know the kind of student athletes who can succeed at Stacy Stone, in addition to being a winner of the game, good things are bound to come your way.

Beary, who was Eastern Basketball's 1988 small college Coach of the Year, is being honored on the occasion of his 75th birthday at dinner throughout the world including the renowned Hoop Group and Five Star Basketball Center.

Beary has also guided several college All Star teams on turnover from throughout the world in such years, he has coached college players on such as Greece, Turkey, South, Cuba, Germany, Lithuania, Missouri, and Antigua to mention a few. He has also guided the Cuban League on his trips to Spain, Italy, Cuba, Australia, and Fiji. Four years ago, Earl Beary found the basic courtiers of Latvia and Lithuania when they played several games throughout a two week period.

Prior to his duties being relinquished entirely towards his coaching responsibilities, Beary served Earl Beary as either the Assistant Athletic Director of Aqueduct Athletic Director for 21 of his 30 years. As an administrator, Beary helped in the foundation of building the athletic department into a well respected NCAA entity where students athletes received both on and off the court, and have gone on to compete regionally and nationally.

A native of Queens and one of six children, Beary played high school basketball at St. Agnes before heading to Saint John where he was a four year letter winner. He was also the recipient of the College's 1960 Distinguished Alumni Award.

The three time captain with eight among the school's top 10 career leaders in both points and steals. A two-time All Conference selection who was the team's first "Knute Rockne" Player as a senior, Beary entered the coaching ranks at the tender age of 23 when he filled the head coach's position at the Junior College of Albany in 1962. Beary then returned to his alma mater in 1964 and two years later was named the College's second head coach. The rest you now know about.

Beary also directs his own successful youth basketball camp every summer at the College. He was the founder of the Earl Beary Summer Sports Academy and is also the founder of the aforementioned New York State Basketball Coaches Association Hall of Fame.

Furthermore, Beary was actively involved with the development office as a member of the former Capital Campaign for St. John, including the campaign to build the College's indoor and outdoor athletic facilities. Beary also brings the popular Annual Morris Basketball Golf Caddy that is held in its seventeenth year.
